



# Sensible Firearms Act

Criminal Law Title 2

Amended at 6th of January, 2024

AN ACT TO Regulate the Ownership, Possession, and Use of Firearms, Establishing Distinctions Between Personal Defense Weapons, Restricted Military-grade Weapons, and Weapons of Mass Destruction, to Safeguard Public Safety, Strengthen National Security, and Ensure Responsible Firearms Ownership

**The Parliament of the Republic of Rosava, representing its people, with the will of the President of the Republic of Rosava representing the same, and the Chancellor of the Office, enacts the following in its full text for the betterment of the nation;**

## **§ 1. Categories of Weapons**

- (1) Civil-grade Weapons
  - (a) Pistols: Limited to semi-automatic capacity
  - (b) HP Rifles: Rifles made for hunting and only allowed without reinforced barrel and weapon body
- (2) Military-grade Weapons
  - (a) SMGs
  - (b) LMGs
  - (c) Rifles
  - (d) Heavy Rifles
  - (e) HP Rifles
  - (f) Flamethrowers
  - (g) Shotguns
  - (h) Explosive Weapons
- (3) Weapons of Mass Destruction
  - (a) Nuclear Weapons
  - (b) Biological Weapons
  - (c) Chemical Weapons

## **§ 2. Categorical restrictions**

- (1) Owning Civil-grade Weapons
  - (a) Every civilian, so long as not prohibited by §4, is able to own and use a Civil-grade Weapon. The guns may also be used for self-defence
- (2) Owning Military-grade Weapons
  - (a) Military-grade Weapons may only be used and owned by the Gendarmerie, NPA and Rosavian Security Service. The police may also use Military-grade Weapons during emergencies
- (3) Owning Weapons of Mass Destruction
  - (a) Only the government itself and holders of the WMD-EAL are allowed to own Weapons of Mass Destruction, while only the government is allowed to use them

## **§ 3. Licencing**

- (4) Licensing Categories
  - (a) Civil-Grade Weapons License (CGL): Production and sale of firearms for civilian and restricted civilian use
  - (b) Military-Grade Weapons License (MGL): Exclusive production and sale of Military-grade and Civil-grade weapons
    - (i) Being a holder of a MGL only gives one the right to produce Military-Grade Weapons and sell these to entities with the right of owning them
  - (c) Weapons of Mass Destruction Exceptional Authorisation Licence (WMD-EAL): Grants the exclusive right to produce and sale Weapons of Mass Destructions
    - (i) Being a holder of a WMD-EAL only gives one the right to produce Weapons of Mass Destruction and sell these to entities

with the right of owning them

(5) Licence registration

- (a) CGL and MGL licences may be issued to every citizen after registration with the Ministry of Justice, as long as the citizen is not ineligible to obtain a licence
- (b) WMD-EAL may be issued by the Ministry of Justice with approval of both the parliament and the president to a holder of an MGL licence

**§ 4. Penalties and Enforcement**

(1) Production and storage

- (a) Illegal production or ownership of firearms or firearm parts is strictly prohibited and is punishable with a fine no less than £75<sup>1</sup>


(2) Judicial Authority to Restrict Firearm and Licence Ownership

- (a) In cases where public safety is at risk, judges have the authority to rule that certain individuals are ineligible to own firearms and production licences

(3) Revocation of Licences


- (a) Violations of licensing conditions constitute a crime which is punishable with a fine no less than £75 and potential revocation of the granted licence<sup>1</sup>
