CHAPTER I: Of the State

Article I.I Crestmont is a governorate within the Republic of Rosava where the elected governor has all the power over legislation, jurisdiction and execution of Crestmont. However, the Republic of Rosava's Government holds higher authority than the Crestmont Governor.

Article I.II The governor holds the ceremonial title of King if male and Queen if female. If the governor identifies as non-binary, they can choose which title they prefer.



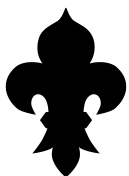
Article I.III A governor is to be elected every month on the third day of the month with the majority of the votes. According to the Polynesian Calendar, this is the 152nd day of every fourth year.

Any citizen of Crestmont can run as governor.

Article I.IV The official name of the State is to be Crestmont Governorate (Gouvernorat de Crêmont in French).

Article I.V The official languages of Crestmont are to be English and French.

CHAPTER II: Of the Constitution



Article II.I This document is the Constitution of Crestmont, and can only be modified by the governor.

Article II.II The Constitution applies to all citizens of Crestmont.

CHAPTER III: Of the Legislation

Article III.I The only individual fit for legislating, writing and finalising laws is the governor.

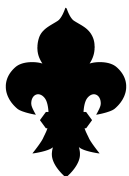


Article III.II The citizens of the State have the right to publicly criticise any decisions or laws made by the governor.

ARTICLE IV: Of the Individual Rights

Article IV.I Every citizen of Crestmont has the right to vote in Crestmont elections or public referendums.

Article IV.II Every citizen of Crestmont has the right to a job inside the governorate of Crestmont, regardless of criminal history or



status. This is to be guaranteed by the
Rosovan Government.

Article IV.III Every citizen has the right to a
home to stay in.
